Flower Power Prints

Create colorful **monoprints** using real flowers and paint, inspired by the work of MMA Currents artist **Ken Hale**. **Monoprints** are images that can only be made once, so each time you create something unique and magical!

MATERIALS

- Flowers
- Paint (acrylic or washable)
- Sturdy Paper
- Roller (brayer) or Sponge
- Foil Tray or Baking Sheet



STEP ONE

Put about **4 dime size drops** of paint on your tray



STEP TWO

Use a **brayer or sponge** to spread an even layer of paint all over the tray



STEP THREE

Place your sheet of paper on the paint, rubbing the back with an even pressure.

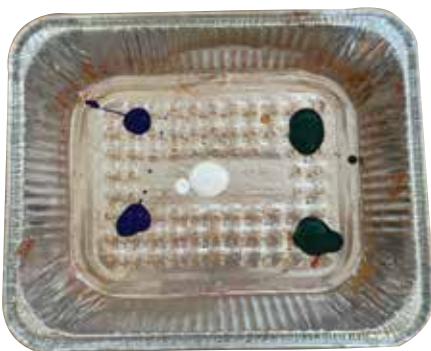
Peel back paper and set aside to dry



STEP FOUR

Wipe down tray to remove paint, grab an additional tray

Repeat Steps 1 and 2, using a different paint colors



STEP FIVE

Arrange flowers on paint tray, using a variety of sizes and shapes

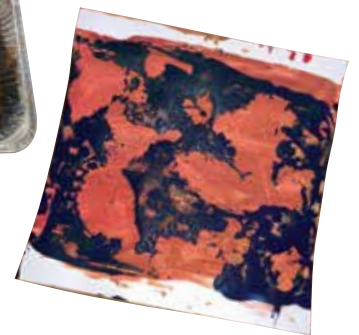
Place your dry paper **paint side down** on top of your arrangement



STEP SIX

Apply pressure over the whole paper, especially around the flowers

Peel and reveal!
